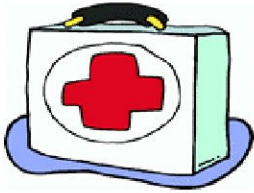


## Boaters' First Aid Equipment



### Water Proof Container (hard or soft side)

#### Topical Applications

##### Bandages

- Band aids – variety of sizes
- Butterfly bandages
- Knuckle bandages

##### Gauze Pads and Roll

##### Roll of Adhesive Tape

##### Sutures

##### Cortizone/Hydrocortizone

##### Iodine/Betadine (antiseptic)

##### Hydrogen Peroxide (antiseptic)

##### Medi Burn Gel

##### Anti Biotic cream or ointment

##### Alcohol Swabs

##### Moleskin

##### Lidocaine (anesthetic for insect bites and minor skin inflammation)

##### Sun screen/Sun block

##### Sting Relief Towelettes/After Sting Pads

##### Ibuprophen (Advil)

##### Medimeclizine – motion sickness

##### Antihistamine (Benadryl -- for colds AND bee/insect stings)
